Terrain:

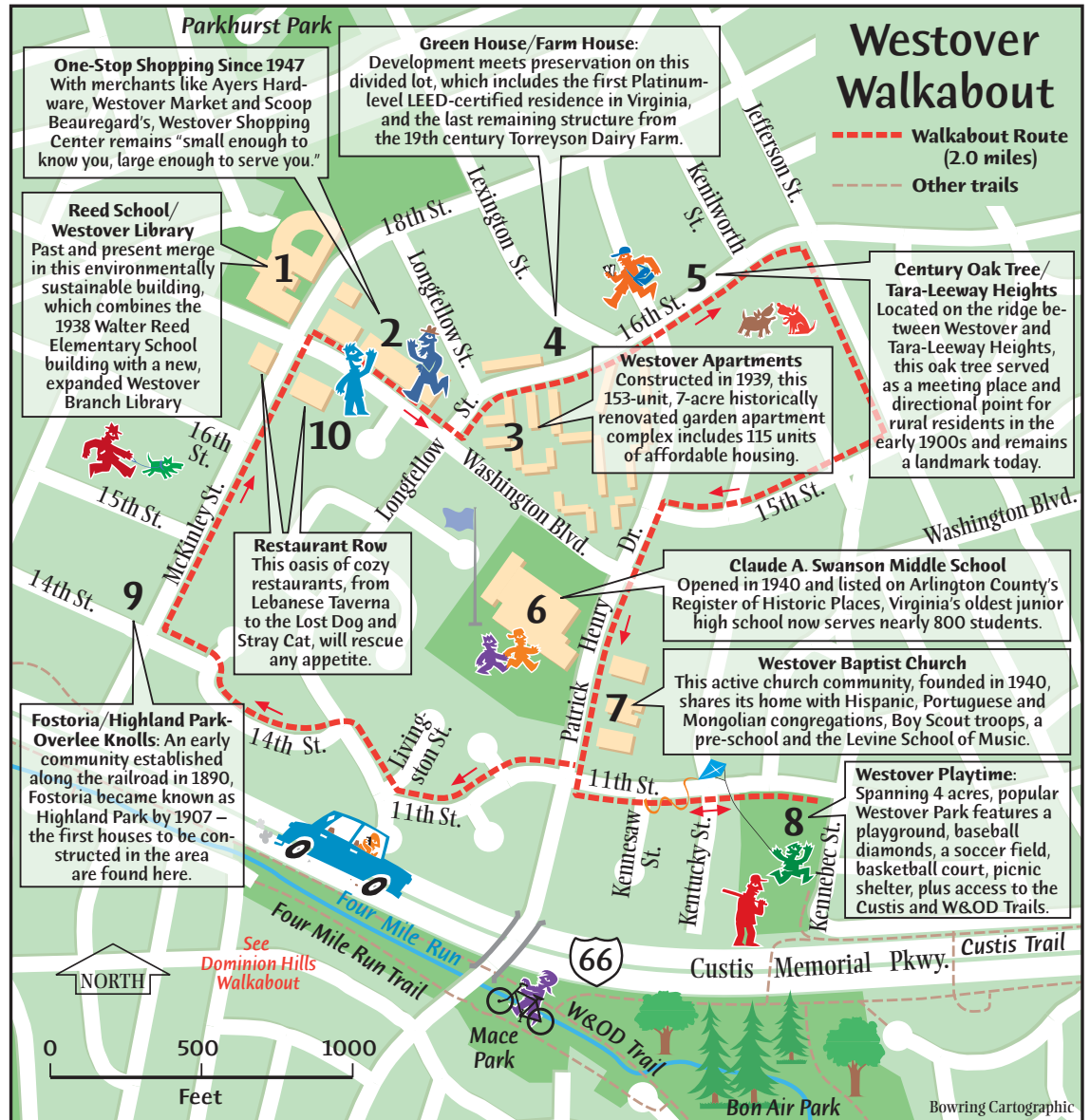
Rolling terrain with winding residential streets, two wide connecting boulevards, and easy access to paved trails.

Westover walks the walk in living up to its motto, "We take time to care." Located in the western section of Arlington County, Westover was mostly farmland until 1940, when plots were subdivided for housing, the Westover Shopping Center was built, and Claude A. Swanson Junior High (now Middle) School opened. By 1952, Westover and adjacent neighborhoods looked much as they do today.

In 2006, the Westover neighborhood was placed on the National Register of Historic Places and now boasts a state-of-the-art complex integrating the Reed School and Westover Library. With a mix of housing and access to public transit, multi-use trails, shops, restaurants and services, this friendly, self-sufficient and supremely walkable neighborhood retains a mid-century character that evokes memories of a simpler time!
